Hola. I am Claudia Castellanos. My husband, Alcides (also called Al), is the pastor of Cristo Salva Bilingual Church in Los Angeles, California. Our ministry includes serving a free dinner for 60 to 100 people every Wednesday. They all hear the message of salvation, too.

Alcides and I believe the time we spend sharing food opens a door for people to meet Jesus.

Our two daughters, Dianne and Kristy, help in the ministry of the church. They lead worship with music. Dianne plays a keyboard [*like a piano*] and Kristy sings with her.

We have been blessed by the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering*. It allows us to feed people who don't have a place to live. It allows us to give backpacks to children for school. We also go to Mexicali, Mexico, to share the gospel and provide food and clothing.
