

LEN CHOA

Play this traditional Southeast Asian children's game.

WHAT YOU DO:

1. Pair up. One player (tiger) will need one game piece of one color. The other player (leopards) will need six game pieces of another color.
2. The tiger player will place her playing piece on the board at the top of the triangle.
3. The leopards player will place one leopard on any place on the board where lines meet.
4. Take turns. The tiger player will move along the lines one dot at a time per turn.
5. The leopards player will place one leopard at a time on the board for each turn until all her leopards are on the board. She may not move any
6. of her leopards until all her leopards are on the board. Once all leopards are on the board, she may move pieces along the lines on her turns.
7. The tiger may jump a leopard and capture it if there is an empty space on the other side of the leopard. The tiger may not land on a space where there is already a leopard.
8. The object of the game is for either the tiger to be trapped by the leopards so it can no longer move or for the tiger to capture enough leopards by jumping over them that there are not enough leopards left to capture the tiger.
